## Eligibility for free Hepatitis B vaccine in Queensland

This fact sheet explains eligibility for free hepatitis B vaccine in Queensland under either the State or the National Immunisation Program

## Refugees and other humanitarian entrants are eligible for funded catch-up vaccines.

Migrants from hepatitis B endemic countries are recommended testing for hepatitis B, and vaccination if appropriate because they are more likely to:

- have been previously infected with hepatitis B virus
- have a close household contact with chronic hepatitis B.

### Migrants (with a Medicare Card) are eligible for funded vaccines if they are from:

Areas of high endemicity, indicated by high seroprevalence of hepatitis B surface antigen, include:

- most of East and Southeast Asia (except Japan)
- · Pacific island countries
- parts of central Asia and the Middle East
- the Amazon Basin
- sub-Saharan Africa.

#### Other eligible risk groups include:

- household or other close (household-like) contacts of persons with hepatitis B
- persons with hepatitis C or chronic liver disease
- HIV positive adults and other immunocompromised adults
- · sexual contacts of people with hepatitis B
- persons who inject drugs
- sex workers
- infants from birth receive a birth dose hepatitis B vaccination followed by 3 doses of hepatitis B containing combination vaccine at 6 weeks, 4 months and 6 months

- low-birth weight preterm newborn infants (<2000g), and/or infants born at <32 weeks gestation (irrespective of weight), it is recommended to receive a booster of hepatitis B-containing vaccine at 12 months of age
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

All people (except for children commencing their immunisation schedule) require hepatitis B serology before hepatitis B vaccination.
