Scholarship Guidelines

Application process: Scholarship applications open 17 August 2023 and will remain open for 6 weeks. Applications close at 11:59pm Thursday 23 November.

Scholarship applications must be submitted through an online form, with required evidence emailed to scholarship@eccq.com.au. Applications submitted through any other means will not be accepted.

A person may only apply for one scholarship category. Ensure that the guidelines and specifics of each scholarship are read carefully to ensure that the application is accepted.

General eligibility: All applicants must be female and culturally linguistically diverse and reside in Queensland. Definitions used for Culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) is as follows:

Culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) is a broad term used to describe a person who may natively speak a language other than English and/or identify with an ethnic background, nationality, cultural traditions or religion that is different to the majority community of Australia.
